

Adverse impact (AI) has been a recurring problem for decades, but we are still without a viable theory, consistent processes or programs to reduce or eliminate AI, or a body of research that informs the laws that govern employment practices, despite some findings that have helped us to understand the problem and create modest solutions.

The objective of the fund is to encourage scholars to engage in programmatic research that blends I-O psychology, public policy, and the law in efforts to further inform us on the underlying factors that lead to AI and methods for its reduction.

George C. Thornton III Graduate Scholarship

The George C. Thornton III Graduate Scholarship recognizes the application of the scientist-practitioner model in graduate student training. The Scholarship is designed to provide financial support to doctoral students in I-O psychology who epitomize the scientist-practitioner model in their training, research, and practicum experiences.
